## A farewell to Hilary Dodman

Hilary Dodman has come to the end of her term of office as Chair of Arts Richmond and stood down at the Annual General Meeting on Wednesday 2 December 2020.



Here is a tribute written by Cllr John Coombs, an Arts Richmond Vice President: *Years ago while having a summer Sunday afternoon stroll in the Woodland Gardens in Bushy Park we heard, from the opposite bank of the lake, jazz music. This was our introduction to Hilary. For many years and still continuing*



*to this day, Hilary has used this, and similar events in Hampton, to raise money for local charities.*

*When RuTAC, as Arts Richmond was then known, needed to find a recipient of musical instruments it owned, Richmond Music Trust was the natural beneficiary. I was unaware then that Hilary was one of its Trustees who decided to accept ownership. It was through her activities in the local music scene that Hilary was recruited onto the Executive committee, in time becoming its Deputy Chair. I was always impressed by her diligence in fulfilling any of the tasks she undertook. The amount of exploratory trips she made as she re-invigorated 'Showcoach' is just one example of her commitment. In her six (and a bit) years as Chair of artsrichmond this commitment has resulted in a number of new initiatives whilst enhancing treasured and long standing events. One of these highlights had small beginnings. When Hilary first began speaking about celebrating the 50th*

*anniversary of RuTAC/Arts Richmond little did I expect that there would be a month long 'Golden Thread' exhibition at the Stables Gallery at Orleans House in 2016. I know the hard work put in by so many stalwarts of the Borough's cultural scene to create something so remarkable and as a fitting tribute to Hilary's leadership. I trust Hilary will join the rest of us former Chairs in continuing to support the work of the Executive committee in supporting members and affiliates.*

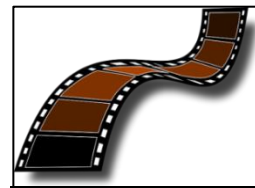

As well as representing the voluntary arts sector on the Richmond upon Thames Borough Council's *Arts Advisory Forum*, we provide a wide variety of services and events aimed at promoting local arts and cultural activity including:

**Regular Information** about *What's On* and *How to Get involved* in the thriving local arts & cultural scene through our *website*, and monthly *What's On Newsletter*.

**Showcoach:** Excursions to plays, musicals, operas, concerts and places of interest – some with coaches from pick-up points across the borough. We know how important safe transport and companionship is for our members and we make every effort to ensure ease of access for all.

**Literature:** We run literary events throughout the year including our annual *Book Picnic* on Richmond Green, and *Young Writers' Festival*, as well as events in the Richmond upon Thames Literature Festival.

**Drama:** We promote the performances of local professional and amateur theatre companies and run the *Swan Drama Awards* – our local version of the Oscars – rewarding amateur talent in the borough – as well as a *New Plays Festival*.

**Music:** We promote the extensive programme of concerts organised by concert societies, choral and other music groups throughout the borough and run an annual *Choral Workshop* with eminent local conductors.
